Animal Control Bylaw Enforcement

Please be reminded that the Town of LeRoy has an Animal Control Bylaw that requires dogs to be kept in an enclosure constructed in accordance with the bylaw and leashed any time it is out of the enclosure. This bylaw also enforces items such as: the number of animals allowed, running at large, litter, and nuisance (barking, howling, etc.) and applies both to dogs and cats. We would like to remind residents to be considerate of their neighbours and control your pets whether it be barking, running at large, or defecating.

A Word on Permits...

Applications are available at the Town Office. You require a permit for the following reasons:

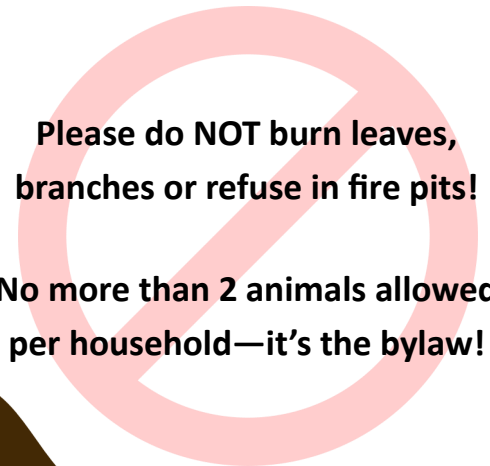
- *Construction including decks, garages, additions
- *Demolition or moving of buildings
- *Restricted Dogs, *Fire Pits, *Fireworks

Building permits expire six months from the date of issue. Building permits require Council approval before construction can begin.

SaskAlert is Saskatchewan's emergency public alerting program which will provide critical information on emergency events as they are occurring and the Town of LeRoy is now a trained member!

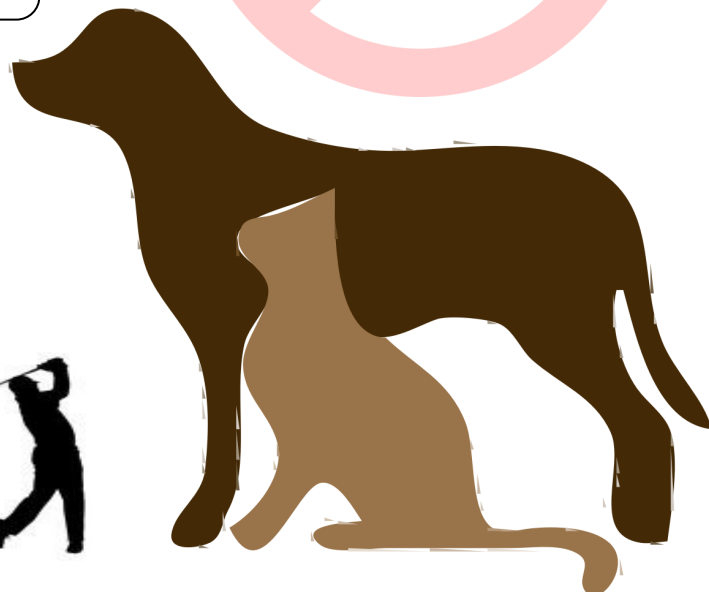
BURNT OUT STREET LIGHTS

COMPOSTING RULES at REACT SITE

The composting area to the right of the Transfer Station gate ("Town Side") has been closed to public access due to non-permissible items being dumped. Composting areas are for tree branches, garden refuse, grass clippings, etc., NOT for paint cans, kitchen tables or painted wood items. We apologize for the inconvenience.

Compost & Branch Pick-up

Town employees are doing weekly pick-up of compost on **Fridays**.

Compost must be in clear or orange refuse bags for easy removal and will only be picked up if left in back alleys or if no alley, in front yard.

Small amounts of tree branches may be picked up as well, if they are in manageable lengths.

Please do not mix grass clippings and refuse with tree branches as they will not be picked up.

If you have a lot of tree branches, we would ask that you either call the office for our custom rates or deliver them directly to the REACT Transfer Station Wednesday or Saturday during regular hours free of charge.

NOTICE TO RESIDENTS UNDER THE LEROY & DISTRICT FIRE DEPARTMENT COVERAGE AREA

The LeRoy and District Fire Department requires that any resident or individual contact the 9-1-1 dispatcher before the commencement of a controlled burn and again upon completion. A controlled burn includes stubble fires, grass fires, old buildings etc. If an unreported controlled burn is responded to by the fire department, the land owner or resident will be charged \$1,000.00 per hour.
