Any cheques dated December 31, 2021 and is in the drop box out front as of the opening of the office on January 4, 2022 will be deposited in the 2021 tax year. Post dated cheques for December 31, 2021 can be forwarded to the Town of LeRoy at any time.

10 Fireplace Safety Tips

- Become a Soot-Stopper Use seasoned hardwood or manufactured logs that burn cleaner that real wood.
- Burn Only Simple Stuff Open the damper before starting a fire and keep it open until the fire is completely extinguished.
 Only burn wood or manufactured logs in your fireplace. Burning pine will leave creosote in the flue.
- **Go for a Slow Burn** A too-hot fire can crack your chimney. Positions logs near the back of the fireplace to prevent fire and ashes from finding a way out the hearth and into your home.
- Open Fireplace Doors Open the fireplace doors and use a fireplace screen. Glass doors can shatter if exposed to high heat.
- Keep the Area Around the Fireplace Clear Don't position your Christmas tree or anything else near the fireplace.
- Don't Leave a Fire Unattended Never leave a fire unattended. Never go to sleep with the fire blazing away.
- Open a Window When You Light Your Fire Fires require about fives time as much oxygen as a room usually needs.
- Clean the Firebox Between Fires If you burn wood, clean the firebox between fires. Scoop cool ashes and place in a metal
 container.
- Have the Chimney Cleaned Yearly for Fireplace safety If the creosote is allowed to build up in the flue, it can suddenly ignite causing a chimney fire.
- Install a Carbon-Monoxide Detector A carbon monoxide detector is a fireplace must have. Stash a fire extinguisher near the fireplace so it's handy.

Garbage Removal REACT **Compost & Branch**

- **AUTO CURBSIDE PICK-UP** is every other Tuesday.
- Bins **MUST** be placed on the front street by the road edge by 7:00 a.m.
- The cost is \$11 per month per cart and will be added to the Utility Billing.
- **ALL** garbage **MUST** be bagged to prevent litter from blowing.
- Cart lids **MUST** be **completely closed** and **NOT** over full.
- Regular garbage includes kitchen waste, containers with food, diapers and bagged animal waste.
- Residential users MAY NOT opt out of the curbside bin program.
- Garbage bag tags are **NO** longer needed for residential pick-up. They can still be used to deposit garbage at the transfer station.
- Tags can still be purchased from the Midway Co-op Grocery Store or the Town Office at \$2.50/tag and taken to the transfer station.
- Return the carts to your property within 24 hours after collection.

REASONS YOUR CART WAS MISSED

- There must be 14 feet of overhead clearance for the arm to reach into the top of the truck. If overhanging branches are in the way, they may be unable to pick up your cart.
- Placed backwards or sideways.
- Lid was not completely closed.
- Vehicle parked too close after it was pulled out.
- Not put out on time.

WEATHER PERMITTING:

- If you **CANNOT** haul to the transfer station, the Town employees will do weekly pick-ups of compost/branches on Fridays.
- COMPOST/LEAVES MUST BE IN CLEAR, ORANGE OR PAPER RECYCLE BAGS. BLACK GARBAGE BAGS WILL BE LEFT BEHIND!

ANIMAL BYLAW ENFORCEMENT


Please be reminded that the Town of LeRoy has an Animal Control Bylaw that requires owners of Pitbull Terrier, American Pitbull Terrier, Pitbull, Staffordshire Bull Terrier, American Staffordshire, Doberman Pinscher, Rottweiler, Wolf Hound, Wolf Cross, Coyote Cross or any dog of mixed breeding of the above breeds to obtain a restricted dog license in the amount of \$200 per year and carry liability insurance in the amount of \$500,000. These dogs must be kept in an enclosure constructed in accordance with the bylaw and are required to be muzzled and leashed when out of the enclosure.

This bylaw also enforces items such as: number of animals allowed, no more than two per household, running at large, litter, nuisance (barking, howling etc.), rabies or other disease and applies to both dogs and cats. We would like to remind residents to be considerate of their neighbours and control your pets; whether it be barking, running at large or defecating.
