

FIRE PITS

Fire pits must be inspected and approved by the Fire Chief before use. Please call the Town Office to make arrangements to have your fire pit inspected and approved.

The following is prohibited from burning in a fire pit: rubbish, garden refuse/leaves, manure, animal carcasses and any material classified as dangerous or will generate a black smoke/offensive odor when burned.

In 2025, SAMA changed the way it valued property within the Town of LeRoy to be based more on size than just per lot. Therefore, if your property dimensions are different then the standard 50 ft by 120 ft lot, you may have had a change in the value of your land as shown on your assessment notice. The value of property in LeRoy has also risen and throughout the province, mostly due to the shortage of available housing. As you can see from the table below, residential taxable assessment values increased by \$6,132,640.



Due to the increase in overall taxable assessment, Council decreased the 2025 mill rate to 7.9 mills and increased the base tax to \$1,250 per lot in order to distribute the tax burden more evenly across properties. This approach was selected due to the philosophy that all properties benefit equally from essential services (such as fire, police, roads, water & sewer, recreation, etc.) regardless of the assessed value of the property.

IT'S THE LAW...



- If an emergency vehicle is stopped on a highway with lights on, you must slow down to 60km/h* when passing, unless emergency personnel are directing traffic then follow their instructions.
- Emergency vehicles have the right-of-way at intersections. Let all emergency vehicles through before safely proceeding.
- Definition of an emergency vehicle: Any vehicle equipped with flashing red or red/blue lights, a siren, police vehicles, fire department vehicles, ambulances, dangerous goods response trucks, some tow trucks, volunteer responder personal vehicles (with red lights, training & designation).











* You do not have to slow to 60 km/h if you are on the opposite side of a divided highway

NOTICE TO RESIDENTS UNDER THE LEROY & DISTRICT FIRE DEPARTMENT COVERAGE AREA

The LeRoy and District Volunteer Fire Department requires that any resident or individual contact the 9-1-1 dispatcher before the commencement of a controlled burn and again upon completion. A controlled burn includes fires, grass fires, old buildings, etc. If an unreported controlled burn is responded to by the fire department, the land owner or resident will be charged \$1,000/hour.

MAINTENANCE REPORTS / UPDATES

- Compost/Leaves MUST be in clear, orange or paper recycle bags.
- Maximum weight per bag is 20 kgs or 44 lbs.
- Please leave branches out of the bags.
- Black garbage bags will not be picked up.
- No animal waste



PLEASE NOTE:

- This service is intended for community members who are unable to haul their own compost/leaves/tree branches.
- Large quantities of branches will need to be coordinated with the Town and a custom work order fee may be applicable.
- Town employees will do their best to pick up weekly, however, in the event of an emergency, unfavourable weather or high priority tasks, compost pick up may not happen.

Please **DO NOT** dispose of oils or grease (including **ANY** cooking oil, bacon grease or other grease) down your sink drains or toilets in your dwelling. When oils and grease are exposed to water and other waste that is in the sewer line they quickly harden up and restrict the flow of any other waste, causing backups. We ask that you dispose of any oil/grease in a suitable container and use a rag or paper towel to wipe the cooking vessel free of residue before washing it.

Running hot water down a drain after disposal <u>DOES NOT</u> help!

PLEASE REMEMBER WHAT YOU POUR DOWN YOUR DRAIN **AFFECTS THE WHOLE TOWN!**



If you spot a burned out street light, please call the Town Office. We will let SaskPower know because they charge us the same amount each month whether the light is on or off!

Also, you can download the SaskPower App or go to www.saskpower.com to report a street light outage.

AUTOMATED CART GUIDELINES

General Guidelines for Garbage:

- ALL garbage must be bagged.
- Broken glass or sharp items should be in a puncture-proof container.
- Items placed beside carts will not be picked up & anything placed on top of carts will result in your cart not being tipped.
- If necessary, compostable material can be put in the waste bin, but must be bagged.
- Do not place tree branches in garbage carts.
- DO NOT OVERFILL your cart! The lid must be closed completely, or your cart will not be tipped.
- Tipping an overfilled cart can cause contents to fall on the street and/or a damaged cart! Replacement cost is \$110.
- Return your cart to your property within 24 hours after collection to help protect your cart from vandalism.
- Place your cart on the curb by 7:00 am on your collection day.
- Place your cart on the street with the wheel slightly away from the curb area.
- Place the arrows on the cart lid toward the street.
- Ensure that there is 4' (feet) of clearance on both sides of your cart and 15' (feet) clearance above. The arms of the truck wrap around the cart and lift it. Therefore, if it is too close to a parked vehicle or other obstruction, it will not be tipped to avoid damage.
- Do not paint or write on cart.
- Do not remove cart from your residence.

Items Not Allowed In Or Near Carts:

- Ashes of any kind
- Automotive parts, oil filters, oil, etc.
- Reno/construction/demo material
- (ex. boards, roofing material, carpet, etc.)
- Sod, dirt, concrete
- Household hazardous chemicals/cleaners
- Dead animals
