## NOTICE TO RESIDENTS UNDER THE LEROY & DISTRICT FIRE DEPARTMENT COVERAGE AREA

The LeRoy & District Volunteer Fire Department requires that any resident or individual contact the 9-1-1 dispatcher before the commencement of a controlled burn and again upon completion. A controlled burn includes, fires, grass fires, old buildings, etc. If an unreported controlled burn is responded to by the fire department, the land owner or resident will be billed at \$1,000 PER HOUR.

#### A MESSAGE FROM FIRE CHIEF PATON

Hello folks,

A little update from the Fire Department. As September comes to and end & the warmer days start to cool off, I would like to remind everyone to be diligent & check their furnaces and heaters. Space heaters are responsible for a significant proportion of heating-related fires, causing 29% of home heating fires. Many users turn them off when the weather warms up & they sit and collect dust until it gets cool out & get put to use again without being checked over. They can reach temps from 538°C - 982°C!

With kids back in school & extracurriculars in full swing, students are going to and from the school in early mornings & into the evenings, not just standard before and after school times. With fall officially here, the sun is setting earlier and I ask that you please take extra precaution when driving at night. Students may be on bikes or on foot and not always wearing reflective clothing.

Fire Prevention Week is October 5-11 this year. I was fortunate to spend a morning at the Daycare at the end of August and we went over muster points at home. Where is a safe spot you and your family meet in case of emergency? Have you checked your fire extinguishers to make sure they are fully charged? This is a good conversation to have in your home.

Lastly - Our Fire Department was asked to spend some time assisting the SPSA (SK Public Safety Agency) up north in Beauval, SK with the wildfire situation. This was an eye-opening experience & our members got to sharpen up on some skills while working along with other Fire Departments. I would like to thank everyone who donated or assisted in helping us out.

## **ADMINISTRATION UPDATES**

Now that fall is here, we would like to mention a couple of reminders for residents and property owners. Property taxes were sent out in June but are technically not due until December 31<sup>st</sup>. The Town offers some discounts for early payment of your property taxes with discounts up to 7% starting in June and ending November 30<sup>th</sup> at 2%. Please ensure that your payment is received here in the office by December 31<sup>st</sup> as there is a 12% penalty for unpaid amounts.

This year, we were busy with building permits including 3 new houses, our new LeRoy Daycare facility, a few garages, decks and other projects. It is exciting to see LeRoy growing and building!

This is also a reminder that all decks, covered roofs, some renovations, etc. require a building permit and will be subject to review and inspection by our building officials – Municode Services.

Please call us if you have questions about your project before you start. It is always easier to ask before then to have to redo a project because it didn't follow the zoning bylaw or building code.

This year was also a record year for house sales in LeRoy. It will be interesting to see what next year's census shows for our population. As we continue growing, we have been working on a Strategic Plan for LeRoy.

Watch for updates over the next month or 2 as we want your input on what services or amenities are important to you in LeRoy. Our Service clubs, Sports organizations, Museum, Rink, Fire Dept, etc. are all operated by volunteers. Volunteerism is what LeRoy has excelled at over the years. 

## MAINTENANCE UPDATES

#### TRASH THE WIPES - NOT YOUR PIPES



But... they say flushable:

Even wipes labelled flushable are often made of synthetic fibers, have bonding agents and other additives that slow down or prevent disintegration.

Wipes may breakdown eventually, but they retain their structure a lot longer causing them to clump together or stick to any rough surfaces in pipes, causing blockages.





Please DO NOT dispose of oils or grease (including ANY cooking oil, bacon grease or other grease) down your sink drains or toilets in your dwelling. When oils and grease are exposed to water and other waste that is in the sewer line they quickly harden up and restrict the flow of any other waste, causing backups.





Compost/Leaves MUST be in clear, orange or paper recycle bags.

Maximum weight per bag is 20 kgs or 44 lbs.

Please leave branches out of the bags. Black garbage bags will not be picked up. No animal waste!

Large quantities of branches will need to be coordinated with the Town and a custom work order fee may be applicable. In septic systems and municipal sewer lines, wipes interfere with septic functions, damaging pumps and treatment equipment. This leads to costly repairs and/or replacement of equipment.

Flushing wipes may seem harmless or convenient - but this small act adds up. Especially when done by many people over time.





We ask that you dispose of any oil/grease in a suitable container and use a rag or paper towel to wipe the cooking vessel free of residue before washing it.
Running hot water down a drain after disposal DOES NOT help!

PLEASE REMEMBER WHAT YOU POUR DOWN YOUR DRAIN AFFECTS THE WHOLE TOWN!

#### **PLEASE NOTE:**

This service is intended for community members who are unable to haul their own compost/leaves/tree branches.

Town employees will do their best to pick up weekly, however, in the event of an emergency, unfavourable weather or high priority tasks, compost pick up may not happen.



Each year, September 30 marks the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. The day honours the children who never returned home and Survivors of residential schools, as well as their families and communities. Public commemoration of the tragic and painful history and ongoing impacts of residential schools is a vital component of the reconciliation process. Both the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and Orange Shirt Day take place on September 30.

Orange Shirt Day is a commemorative day led by Indigenous communities to raise awareness about the intergenerational impacts of residential schools on children, families, and communities. It honours Indigenous children who were lost in the residential school system.

The orange shirt symbolizes the loss of culture, freedom, and self-esteem that many Indigenous children experienced. This day reminds us that "Every Child Matters".

On September 30, we encourage all Canadians to wear orange to honour the thousands of Survivors of residential schools.
