- Council approved the purchase of a sewer line camera and it will be added to the custom rate brochure for 2026.

- Council approved the re-design of a new website through Prairie Rising.

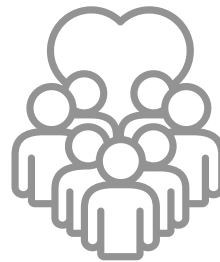

OUT WITH THE OLD . . . IN WITH THE NEW

After a full year of planning and preparation, a crew consisting of Town of LeRoy staff and TSL Mechanical began retrofitting the Town of LeRoy’s water distribution header located within the water treatment plant. What is a header? It is the pipe network that receives the water from the pumps and directs it to the distribution water main feeding the Town. In our case, we have 2 small distribution pumps, 1 large booster pump and flow meters that work together along with a pressure regulation component to maintain a prescribed flow and pressure to the Town’s water system. The original piping was mixed eras of ductile iron that were starting to corrode, pit and show signs of friction wear, causing a shortened service life. Any leaks on this network would mean shutting water down to the whole town for repairs as there was no way to isolate pipe or pump components while maintaining pressure. With this new header, we have more isolation points and updated valve structures built out of corrosion-resistant materials. This results in less service

disruptions when maintenance is performed on pumps and regulators.

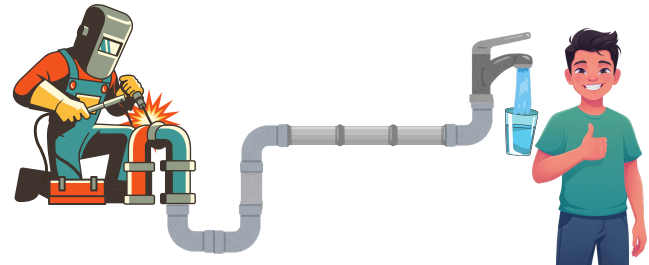
We would like to thank TSL Mechanical for working through the snow storm and completing the project in less than half the time that was allocated for it.

NOTICE TO RESIDENTS UNDER THE LEROY & DISTRICT FIRE DEPARTMENT COVERAGE AREA

The LeRoy & District Volunteer Fire Department requires that any resident or individual contact the 9-1-1 dispatcher before the commencement of a controlled burn and again upon completion. A controlled burn includes, fires, grass fires, old buildings, etc. If an unreported controlled burn is responded to by the fire department, the land owner or resident will be billed at \$1,000 PER HOUR.

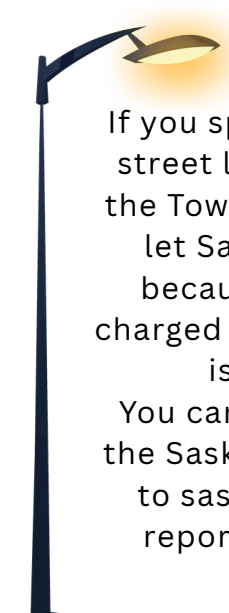
Please DO NOT dispose of oils or grease (including ANY cooking oil, bacon grease or other grease) down your sink drains or toilets in your dwelling. When oils and grease are exposed to water and other waste that is in the sewer line they quickly harden up and restrict the flow of any other waste, causing backups.

We ask that you dispose of any oil/grease in a suitable container and use a rag or paper towel to wipe the cooking vessel free of residue before washing it. Running hot water down a drain after disposal DOES NOT help!

Please remember what you pour down your drain affects the whole town!
